

UNIVERSITE COTE D'AZUR offers you mobility opportunities

Université Côte d'Azur (UniCA) aims to develop its collaboration with the Universidad de Chile. The Formal, Physical and Engineering Sciences Graduate School also known as SPECTRUM is offering grants for stays between January 2025 and July 2026 to lecturers, post-docs and PhD students from the Universidad de Chile with recognized expertise in mathematics, physics, chemistry, astrophysics and/or Earth sciences (B2 level of English required).

NUMBER OF GRANTS OFFERED AND DURATION

- 5 stays of 5 months each for doctoral students
- 4 visits of 12 days each for teaching or training/observation activities for teacher-researchers and scientific engineers.

How to apply

Applications will first be examined by the Universidad de Chile, which will then forward applications to the SPECTRUM Graduate School of Université Côte d'Azur.

To apply, send your application documents written in English, in a single PDF file named last UdeChile_ applicant's name_ applicant's first name_french host lab, to the following email addresses: oguzman@uchile.cl; internacional@uchile.cl; study-ab@uchile.cl.

The documents listed below are required:

- A Curriculum Vitae
- A letter of motivation setting out your scientific project
- (Attached) an evaluation form to be completed by your superior
- A letter of recommendation from your french host laboratory team

In addition, in the case of a doctoral stay:

- A master's transcripts showing your ranking

Applications will be sent to the Université Côte d'Azur by the International Department of the Universidad de Chile. They must be submitted at least 3 months before the actual departure date.

Various sessions will be organized:

1) Deadline: October 15, 2024. Results communicated no later than November 15, 2024.
Mobility between January 2025 and August 2025.

2) Deadline: May 15, 2025. Result communicated no later than June 15, 2025.
Mobility between September 2025 and January 2026.

3) Deadline: October 15, 2025. Result communicated no later than November 15, 2025.
Mobility between January 2026 and July 2026.

Grant recipients will be selected by the SPECTRUM Graduate School committee.

Applications will be assessed on the basis of the candidate's profile and skills, as well as the proven prospects offered by the project in terms of long-term collaboration between the two universities (added value provided by this stay in terms of sharing know-how, interdisciplinarity or future prospects - future post-doctorate, student exchange, etc.).

Funding

Mobility grant for PhD: 850€ per month

Subsistence allowance for staff: 160€ per day

Round-trip travel package for all participants: 1500€
